

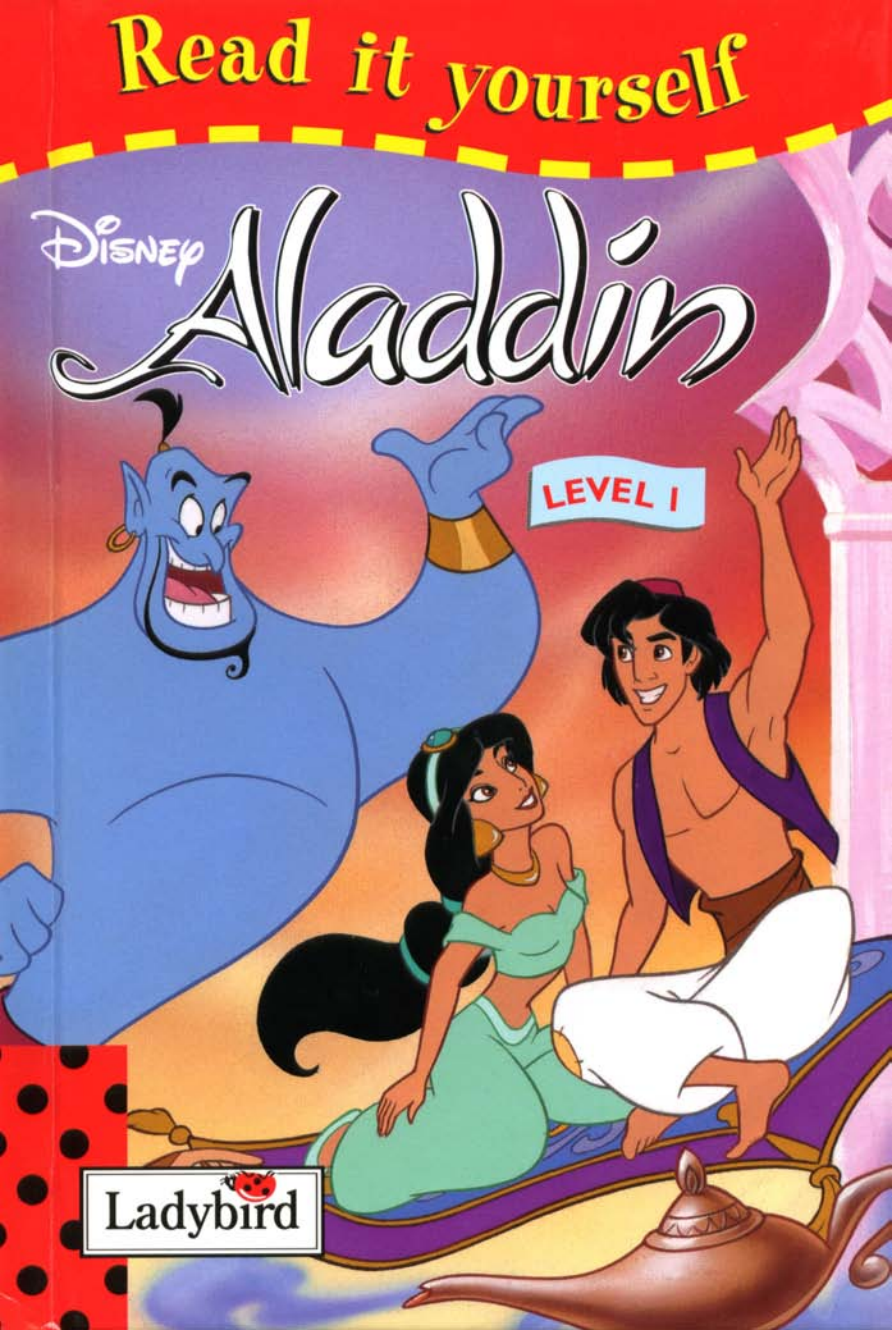

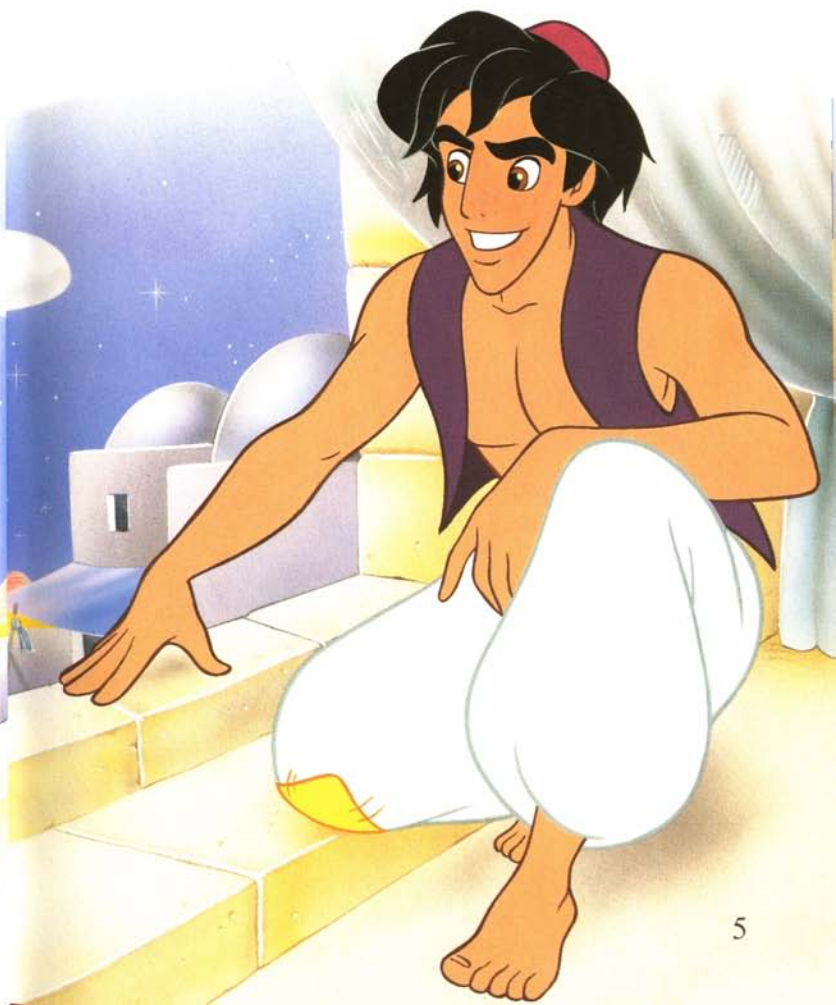

She ran off into the market.

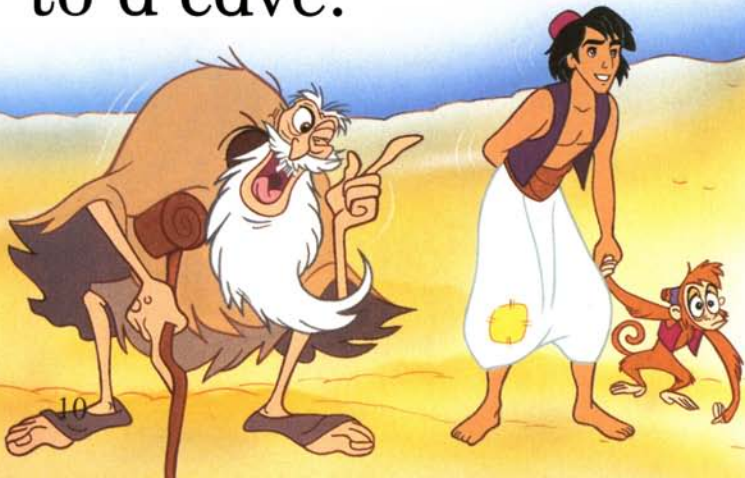
There she met Aladdin. But the palace guards took Aladdin to Jafar.

Sultan's adviser.

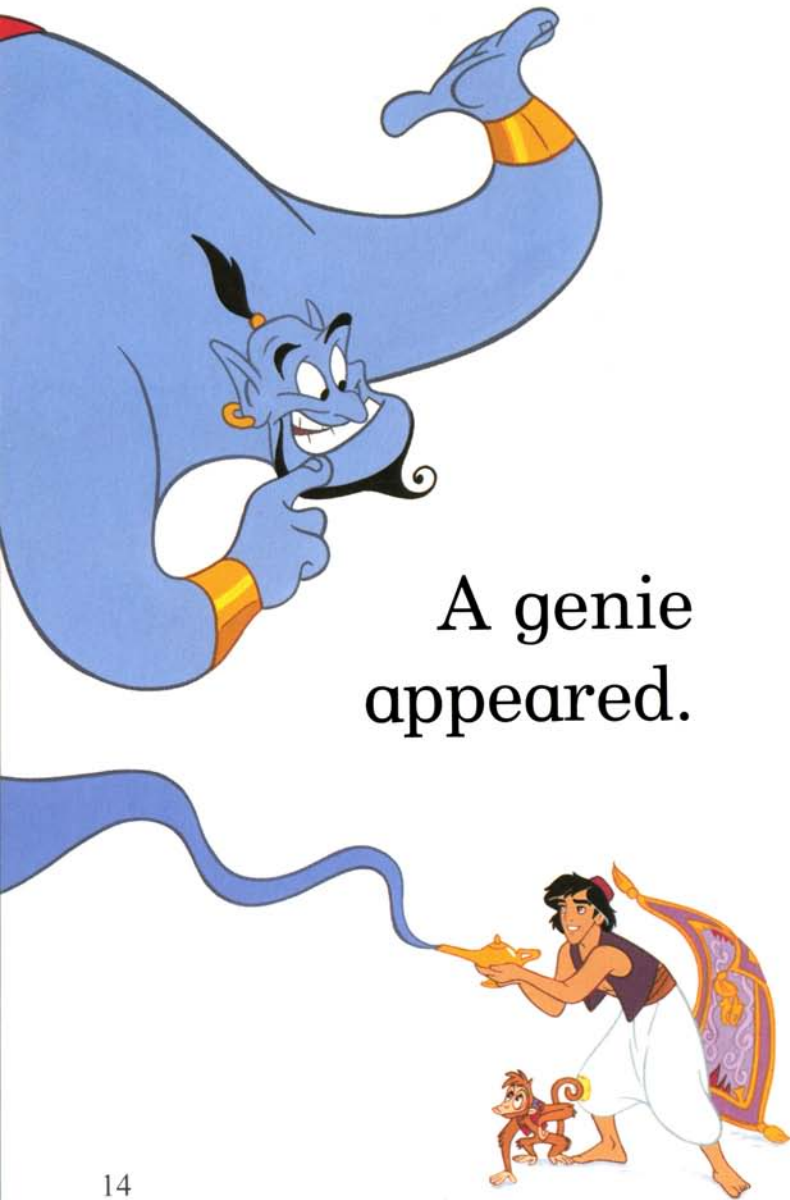
He took Aladdin

an old lamp.



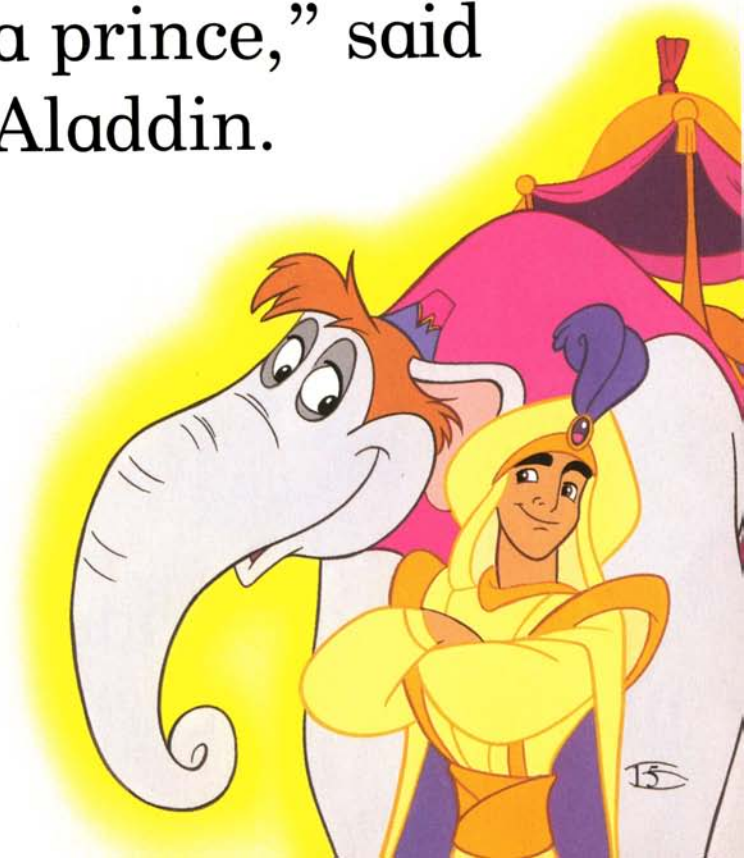
He picked up the

Aladdin.

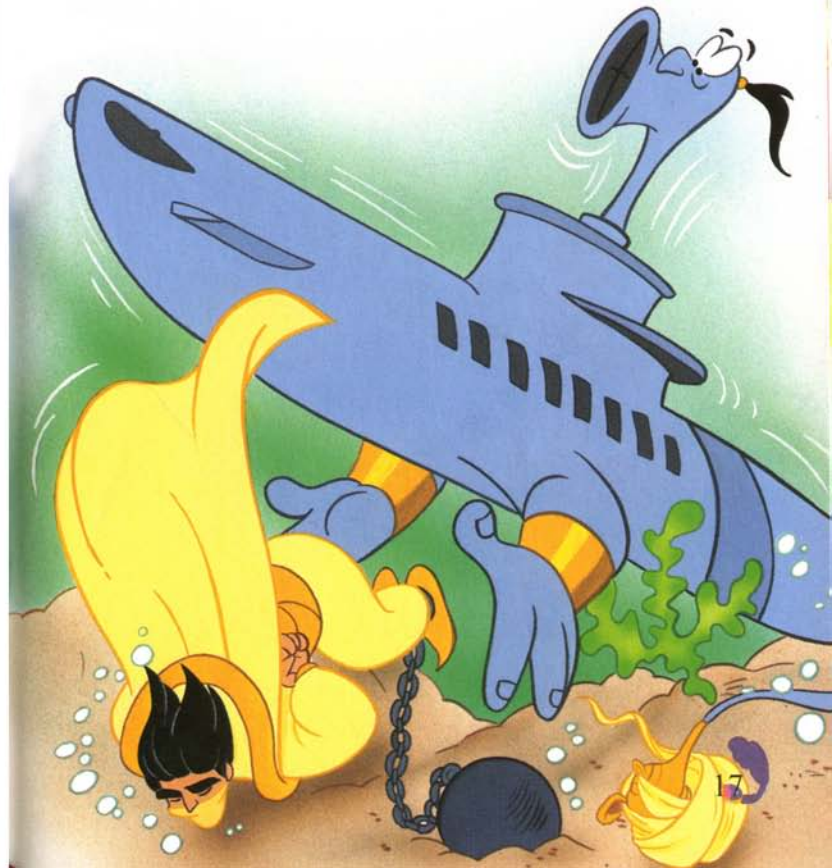






Aladdin took

Jafar turned himself into a snake and fought Aladdin.

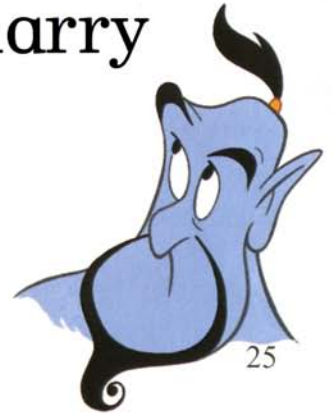
“Now I wish to be a genie,” said Jafar.

*Read it yourself* is a series of graded readers designed to give young children a confident and successful start to reading.

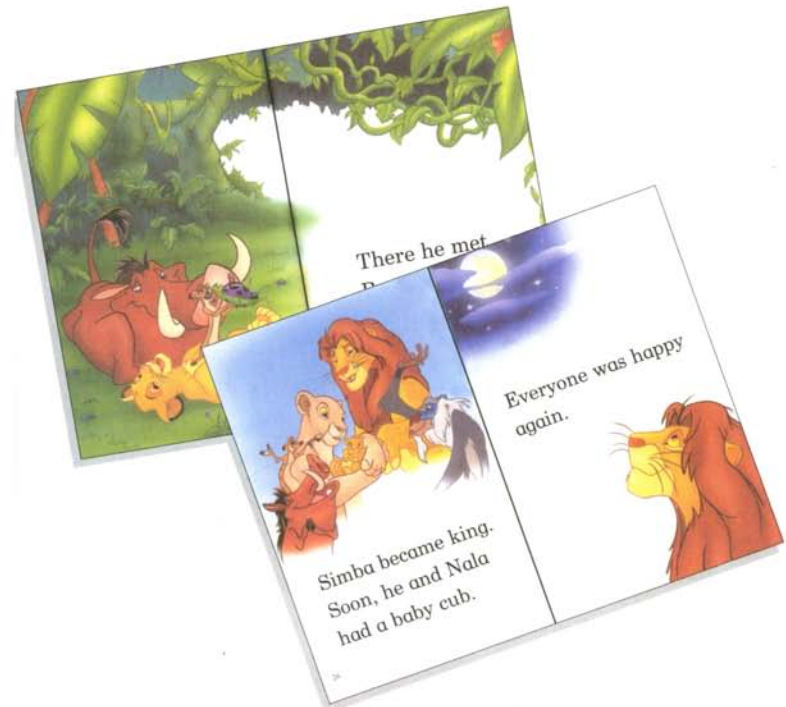

### **About this book**

The pictures in this book are designed to encourage children to talk about the story. After a discussion of the pictures, children can listen to an adult read the story or attempt to read it themselves. Unknown words can be worked out by looking at the beginning letter (what sound does this letter make?), and deciding which word would make sense. *Beginner readers need plenty of encouragement.*
